We collect names, ages, email addresses, farm/company names and postal addresses with every completed IPM plan we receive through this [website](#).

Completed IPM plans will be shared in a controlled manner with our academic partners at the University of the Highlands and Islands (UHI) and ADAS for the purposes of analysis and research supporting this consultation. Appropriate data sharing agreements and contracts are in place to ensure that your personal data is protected, handled securely and only used for these defined purposes.

Email addresses are used to send an acknowledgement of completed plans following submission. They may also be used to contact you in the future in relation to the consultation exercise if you give consent to be contacted.

We will collate and analyse data from all IPM plan submissions. This analysis may be undertaken both internally and with our research partners at the University of the Highlands and Islands (UHI) and ADAS. Findings may be published in form of aggregated reports. We will not publish or otherwise make publicly available any information that directly identifies you (such as names, email or postal addresses).

Data collected as part of the IPM consultation will be retained for 6 years in line with research and reporting requirements, after which it will be securely deleted or anonymised.
